WHISH (Whitby Hidden Impairments Support and Help)

Overview:

WHISH is a self-funded, parent-led charity which supports approximately 150 children and young people in the Whitby rural area who have a hidden impairment.

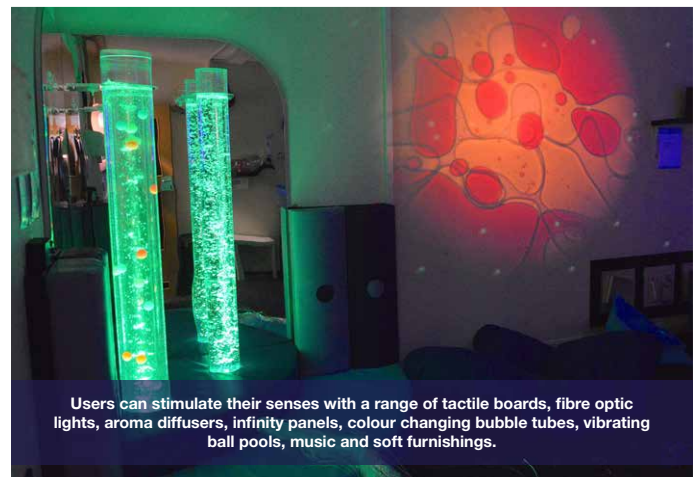
The charity has created a multi-sensory sensory room to assist in the development of coordination, motor skills, colour recognition, communication and sensory skills of its users, who have impairments such as autism, diabetes and epilepsy, as well as rare chromosomal disorders.

The Sirius Minerals Foundation awarded WHISH £5,000 to contribute to the purchase of a range of multi-sensory equipment to put in the room.

The room has become a heavily used area in the centre and has helped to engage the senses of its users on a daily basis. It has been particularly beneficial in helping to calm overactive behaviours, controlling movements to assist in users' rehabilitation and providing a space for children to relax and bond with their parents or carers.



Chairman David Archer visited the sensory unit to meet some of the young people who will benefit from the equipment.



Users can stimulate their senses with a range of tactile boards, fibre optic lights, aroma diffusers, infinity panels, colour changing bubble tubes, vibrating ball pools, music and soft furnishings.
